Last year, when the beautiful young woman, Brittany Maynard, took her own life, the media and advocates for assisted suicide hailed her as a hero. Her courage and individualism were celebrated. In a recent article in the Washington Post, a commentator noted "the country is ready," for assisted suicide. Older people, the sick and disabled are being convinced that their very existence is a burden. To many, the thought of needing or depending on others is repugnant and frightening.

It is absolutely critical for the pro-life community to oppose the growing support for suicide by responding with love and truth. Every human person has dignity and value. Suicide is not an act of compassion, but is an act of utter despair. We are all members of a community, and every act of violence and suicide inflicted on ourselves or another hurts the community. Talk with your family and friends, your community and, mostly especially, those at risk, and encourage them to see the beauty, joy and purpose of each and every life.

Life Notes

- According to Lifenews.com, House Republicans are committed to bringing the pro-life bill to ban abortions after 20 weeks back to the House floor for a vote.
- In Montana, the House passed House Bill 477, which would prohibit physician-assisted suicide within the current state law that prohibits "aiding or soliciting suicide." The Bill will now move on to the Senate.
- According to Majella Pregnancy Centers in Ireland, lives are being saved by the use of ultrasounds when they are provided for women who are considering abortion. In the experience of their counselors, four out of five women will reject abortion when they are able to see their unborn child on a scan.
- Pennsylvania Senator Pat Toomey has signed on as a co-sponsor of the No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion Act (S. 582). The bill codifies a permanent, government-wide policy against taxpayer subsidies for abortion and abortion coverage. It also requires health plans offered under the Affordable Care Act to disclose the extent of their coverage for abortion and the amount of any surcharge for that coverage to consumers.

Reaching Women

The Pro-Life Union's pregnancy hotline continues to be a resource for the pro-life community and the phone number is publicized on pamphlets, cards and outside of churches. The Hotline has been in existence for over thirty years and so many lives have been saved. Our volunteers respond to the questions, needs and concerns of the callers with candor, kindness and support. When a woman calls seeking abortion, we ask simply if she would like to talk about why abortion feels like her only option. Most women open up and share the details of their situation and admit that deep inside, they believe abortion is wrong, but they are not sure what to do. The pro-life community must be ready, willing and able to remove or alleviate the barriers that exist in women's lives. Sometimes that means simply being a sense of support or helping with schooling. One mother we are working with just needed to know that she was not alone and is so comforted by our offers of a new crib, baby clothes and diapers. Many others need a sense of community and lack adequate housing. The Pro-Life Union works with mothers to ensure that women will have safe place to live. We partner with pregnancy homes and also offer individual aid to women to cover their housing costs. Our Hotline is beacon of hope and lifeline for many. The number is 610-626-4006!
