Judge Brett Kavanaugh appears to be an excellent choice for the unborn. His record indicates a pro-life stance. In *Garza v. Hargan*, Judge Kavanaugh forcefully rejected the ACLU's assertion of a new constitutional right of abortion on-demand for illegal immigrant minors in U.S. custody. In *Priests for*

Life v. HHS, he refused to apply Affordable Healthcare Act's burdensome HHS abortifacient mandate to religious entities and was later vindicated by the Supreme Court. Judge Kavanaugh is also a man of faith and is actively involved in his Catholic parish. He and his wife Ashley have two daughters.

Humanae Vitae at 50 Years

In his 1968 encyclical, Humanae Vitae, Pope Paul VI taught that the pill was, in fact, a form of prohibited birth control, yet many Catholic clergy, scholars and laypersons simply refused to accept the decision. That resistance continues in our own day. Humanae Vitae revealed deep wounds in the Church about our understanding of the human person, the nature of sexuality, and marriage as God created it. We still seek the cure for those wounds, but thanks to the witness of St. John Paul II, Pope Benedict, Pope Francis, and many other faithful shepherds, the Church has continued to preach the truth of Jesus Christ about who we are and what God desires for us.

Half a century after Humanae Vitae, the Church in the United States is at a very difficult but also very promising moment. Difficult, because the language of Catholic moral wisdom is alien to many young people, who often leave the Church without ever really encountering her. Promising, because the most awake of those same young people want something better and more enduring than the emptiness and noise they now have. Our mission now, as always, is not to surrender to the world as it is, but to feed and ennoble the deepest yearnings of the world — and thereby to lead it to Jesus Christ, and his true freedom and joy.

My wife, Ann, and I never considered using contraception. It's what the church teaches, so of course we would follow and have throughout our twenty-three-year marriage. It seemed only right and natural to choose Natural Family Planning (NFP).

During our Pre-Cana day, the session that taught about NFP was memorable. Three catholic couples shared about their intimate experiences. One of the key elements they communicated was the joy and closeness that existed when a couple was tracking the wife's cycle together and the man was dutifully writing the information down each morning in her NFP chart. There would be an intimacy that existed during the times of abstinence. Truth be told, it didn't always feel like joy and intimacy. Sometimes I would joke, "I hate NFP!" The fact is that love requires self-denial, self-control, and self-giving.

The challenge with Humanae Vitae is that our modern culture constantly offers and aggressively promotes an ideal world that is like "Pleasure Island" from the story of Pinocchio - the life of no constraints, pleasure as the ultimate aim, and no responsibility or consequences. The problem of course is that Pinocchio's "Pleasure Island" is not real. It's actually a farce where in the end you end up an imprisoned donkey wishing you could just get back home.

I thank God for natural family planning! Ann has been pregnant eight times and we do celebrate great joy and intimacy along with self-control. And yes, I still do track Ann's cycle, but now I use an app on my phone. ©

Pro-Life Court Victory

On Tuesday, June 26th, the Supreme Court ruled in favor of the free speech rights of crisis pregnancy centers in California. The NIFLA v. Berreca case involved California's "Reproductive FACT Act," which would have required pro-life pregnancy centers to display abortion information for low-income women. The pro-abortion group NARAL blamed the 5-4 ruling on the newest Judge, Neil Gorsuch, saying "the anti-choice extremist" judge "sits in a stolen seat."
