




National Pro-Life Bridges Day



The Loss of Miscarriage

We were so full of joy when we discovered my wife, Ann, was pregnant with our first child. When Ann discovered some bleeding in her seventh week we were confused and worried. Miscarriage was mostly an unknown to me; I didn't realize until later how common they were. Ann endured severe cramps and bleeding through the night. I felt helpless as a husband. The nurse on call said nothing could be done, so just see the doctor in the morning. The doctor's visit was sad and stressful, as he did a curettage and we weren't sure how to take care of our lost baby.

The following day there was a surprise knock on our door from our pastor at the time, Bishop Maginnis, who had heard that Ann miscarried. When Ann opened the door, he opened his arms wide, gave her a long hug, and just said, "Oh, Ann." I'll never forget that powerful moment of 'church,' when in my own grief. I didn't know how to console my wife. Later there was another knock on the door from our dear friend, Martha, who said, "You have a choice: you can either let this pain draw you close as a couple or push you apart." Thanks Bishop and Martha.

Tucker Carlson's Story

Well known conservative Fox News host, Tucker Carlson, fiercely defends life, debating with many abortion advocates and Planned Parenthood apologists. What makes Carlson so passionate about the issue?

Mr. Carlson's father, Richard, was born to a 15-year-old girl and was raised in an orphanage. Carlson believes that had abortion been legal, his father would not have been born. His father's growing-up years were "a really messy story." Carlson related, "Just because you make the right decision doesn't mean it's easy." But the story had a happy ending – he and his dad are very close.

When Tucker and his wife Susan were expecting their son, they were advised to abort because testing showed their baby had spina bifida. Susan Carlson informed the doctor, "You're not allowed to kill that child. You know why? Because you are not God." Their son, Buckley, is a tall, strapping young man with no health issues whatsoever. The doctors had it all wrong.

Carlson's story is a reminder that behind every abortion is a person who never had the opportunity to grow up, go to university, get married, or have children of their own. The millions upon millions of babies who have been aborted are not only individual lives that have been snuffed out; they represent entire generations that will never exist.
